- Today is not your lucky day.

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- happy hours – the time of day when a bar sells alcoholic drinks at a reduced price.
- happy ending – the ending of a story or series of events in which the people involved are happy or all problems are solved.
- happy chance – an unexpected piece of good luck.
- the happy day – marriage.
- happy gas – (slang) nitrous oxide.
- happy talk – lighthearted, pleasant conversation; upbeat banter; optimistic remarks.
- lucky you – used to express envy at someone else's good fortune.
- lucky devil – someone with astounding good luck.
- lucky charm – an object kept for good luck.
- lucky break – a stroke of luck; a fortunate event, particularly of the sort that propels one to success, fame, etc.
- lucky bag – a bag filled with collection of unspecified and unknown toys and goodies for children, sold at a fete or fair.
